

We had the pleasure of hosting the Pentecostal Assemblies of Canada (PAOC) General Conference this year at Calvary Temple. Three days of livestreamed business sessions, worship, and workshops, and our teams rose to the challenge. Throughout the week, over a dozen volunteers helped with audio, cameras, facilitated member voting, and set up and operated five simultaneous live streams throughout our buildings – quite the feat!

In November, Derek and Justin Brown, Collin Nickel, and I assisted Christian Camping International with their national conference in Banff. A dozen cases of cameras, cabling, and various equipment were flown out with us to live stream and record their conference. Camps across Canada were able to join the fantastic sessions through our work and hear the amazing testimonies of what God is doing through camps like our own!

A special interest of mine has been to enhance our Sunday sermon series with visual elements to encourage engagement. In September, brainstorming alongside the pastoral team, we landed on a larger-than-life lightswitch to illustrate how we are to invite God's power to flow through us. I constructed a 6 ft. working lightswitch with a lot of drywall and mud, along with some 3D printing. New tech volunteer Hurley Paulson also assisted in getting the mechanics working smoothly on the first Sunday. After our sermon series was completed, we were able to bless Grant Memorial Church's "Let it Glow" Christmas light show community outreach with it to kick off their event.

I am truly blessed to be a part of a church that values and encourages the gifts, creativity and talents of staff and volunteers. I am encouraged by the numerous stories









of people being ministered to in-person and online through our team's faithfulness.
